

Population change 2002-2012




Index 2002 = 100




Population change 2000-2010





- Migration: urban rural; north-south





* Flows with under 5 000 persons are shown only in case that there are no larger flows related to one country - the main minor flow shown to EE, IS, LI, LV, MT & SI




Diversity of migration in intra-ESPON flows



 Map: International migration between the Nordic Countries




International / Transnational



Map: Migration between Central Baltic Countries








Migration intensity in 2010


 In- and outmigration vs netmigration





• Diverse pattern

- Nordic challenge with increasing population but decreasing labour force
 - Similar development in Scotland, North-East France and in some Spanish regions
- Sjælland & Midtjylland (DK) and Etelä-Suomi (FI) are the regions with highest difference bw population and labour force change
