




Readyness is there, fears too





68% of Estonians and 64% of other nationalities approve of mixed groups and integrated school classes, only 9% of Estonians and 10% of other nationalities consider it negative (Estonian Integration Monitoring 2017).





Estonian language training in general education

- By the end of lower secondary school, **69,2% of non-Estonian speaking students speak Estonian at least on B1 level**. Among the graduates of only Russian language lower secondary school s there are 61.4% speakers of Estonian on B1 level (if counting language immersion, then 63,5%).
- Following the swich to instruction in Estonian language in higher secondary school level, the language skills among the higher secondary school graduates has slightly improved. The first youths who passed at least 60% of all subjects in curriculum in Estonian language graduated in 2014. When back then 22% of all graduates did not reach B2 level, then in 2018 this figure was 19% among youths.





Self-assessed Estonian language skills among other nationalities based on age in 2015 and 2017., % (EIM 2015 and 2017)






How education influences integration
