- founded 1994
- 8 locations in Tampere: in the city center, Hervanta and Tesoma (and in Hämeenlinna: RIKU)
- 75 employees
- approximately 150 volunteers


Hae Apua! – English

Sexual violence

Sexual violence refers to sexual acts that are done to you without your consent.

These acts include sexual touching and sex that you don't consent to.

The act may be wrong and a crime, even if it doesn't cause you physical pain or you are married to the offender.
