NSH is secretariat for the cooperation programme between Nordic Council of Ministers, Northwest-Russia and the three Baltic countries aimed at disabled children and their families.

The cooperation programme is a 3-years programme runs from 2006-2008. I am the project manager .

The organisation of the programme is that national steering committees have been established in every country.

In Estonia the steering is very active. A conference about "design for all" was held in January 2007. In March last year was held a conference "The wellbeing of a disabled child".

A study visit in Sweden took just place financed by the local Council of Ministers office "practice in institutions".

Based on the results of the conference in March last year this conference was decided and planned. The answered of a questionnaire showed that it is important to focus on the important role of the municipalities to implement the legislation and to provide a broad range of services aimed at disabled children and their families.

The steering committee wants with this conference to get in contact with politicians, leaders and staff from municipalities and have a dialogue about good examples from Estonia and from the Nordic countries to get inspired to develop each municipals service. Therefore municipals are invited to join this project.
