




































































Why the case led to prosecution

The case was built on a strong collaboration between the police, prosecutors and child protection services, and invoked bilateral cooperation with the authorities in the countries of origin of the perpetrators and victims.


- •The defendants claimed their actions were not criminal, but a part of their culture, and that the police were discriminating them because of their romani background.
- •Despite of the evidence, two of the child victims (the eldest) refused to admit any mistreatment.
















Aggreved parties often deny that they are being subjected to violence, force or other forms of coercion because they fear reprisals against themselves or their families in the country of origin.

In spite of the other evidence in the case, NN has denied being a victim of human trafficking or involved in prostitution.
