Operational Action 5.1. Subproject ETUTU/ETUTU networking

Action Leader: Germany, Co-Leader: NL

Participants: AT, BE, DK, ES, FI, FR, IE, IT, NO, LU, PT, SE, UK



Objective: To tackle Nigerian criminal networks trafficking victims for sexual exploitation and other forms of exploitation across the EU

Operational aim: Using/extending the ETUTU network to **support** international **investigations**

Realization in the form of **2 meetings** p.a. of MS and EUROPOL, EUROJUST, FRONTEX, CCWP, INTERPOL + delegation of the central THB office in Nigeria (NAPTIP) and intensive 'networking'

ISF funded from 2017 until 2019

Subproject ETUTU Achievements in 2016
