






An historical fall





An historical fall

- Nearly 163,000 asylum seekers, of which 134,000 came during the fall
- The highest monthly figure in October: 39,200
- Urgent need for accommodation
- The asylum process became significantly prolonged



Lessons learned from the former Director of the Swedish Migration Board

- Constant communication, internally and externally
- Think of all perspectives. What are the consequences?
- Proportions. Do not play it down, do not exaggerate
- Show empathy and a humanitarian commitment
- Clear set of values to guide you
- Have the courage to make difficult decisions and prioritize
- Take command, active action, concrete action
- Keep calm
- Consider the long term perspective perseverance
- Involve others. The entire society's responsibility
- Establish a good
