A: Higher education institutions (HEI) and regional competitiveness

- 1) What types of HEI-generated knowledge have the highest impact on regional competitiveness, and does this vary across regions?
- 2) What are the problems of regional HEIs in terms of creation, diffusion and absorption of knowledge?
- 3) What is the balance in local HEI-generated knowledge compared with HEIs outside of the region? Are lecturers local or commuting from parent universities?
- B: The role of regional HEIs in developing triple helix cooperation clusters
 - 4) To what extent do regional HEIs, R&D units and vocational schools realise that they form a regional innovation system? Do they collaborate? How?
 - 5) In what forms do HEI-generated knowledge flows most effectively achieve the highest positive feedback from regional stakeholders?
 - 6) Do regional HEIs have a positive impact on enterprise clustering and other forms of networking?
