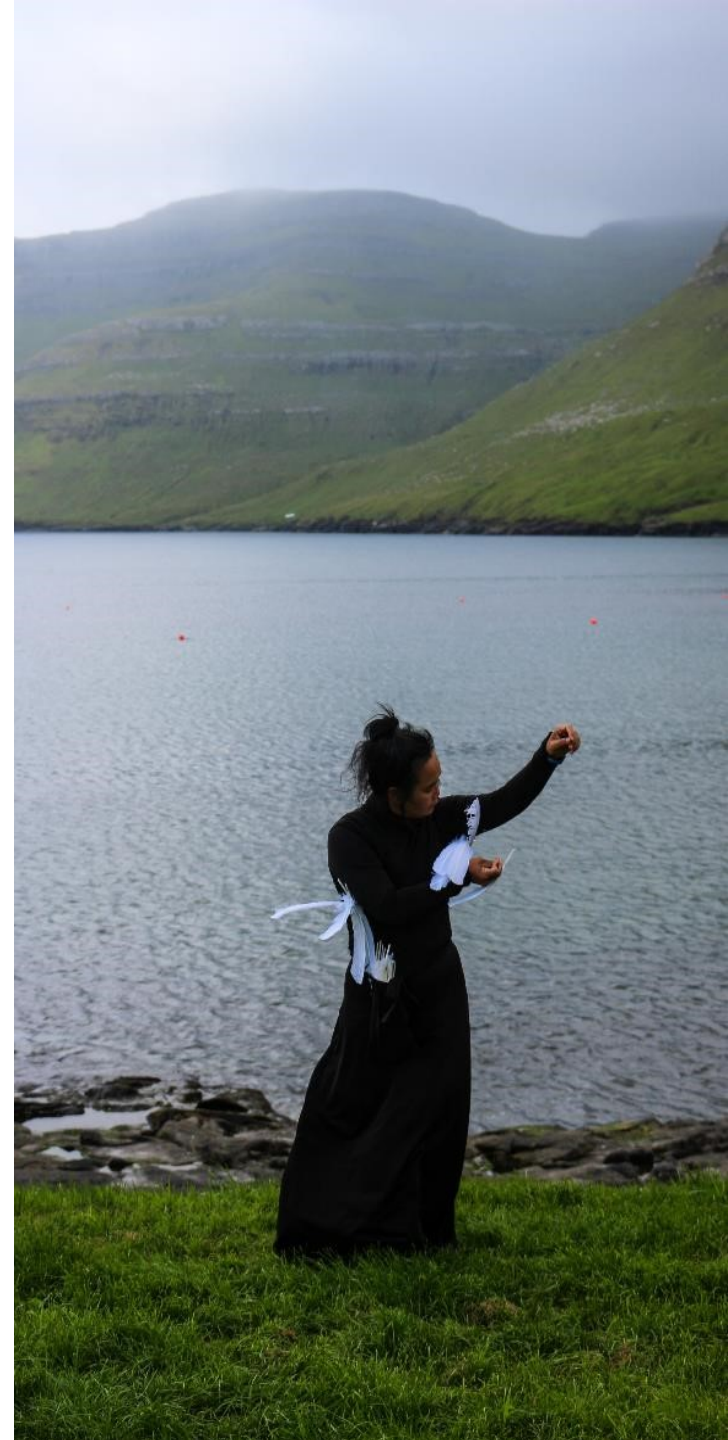

Four funding programmes

- Arts and Culture Programme
- Nordic-Baltic Mobility Programme for Culture
- Norden 0–30
- Volt – arts and culture programme for children and young people



Arts and Culture Programme

The Arts and Culture Programme supports Nordic co-operation in the field of arts and culture. Funding is granted for innovative projects of a high artistic and cultural quality, which promote diversity and sustainability in the Nordic Region.



Arts and Culture Programme

Anyone within the field can apply. The project partners must come from at least three countries, of which at least two must be Nordic countries.

Funding can be granted as follows:

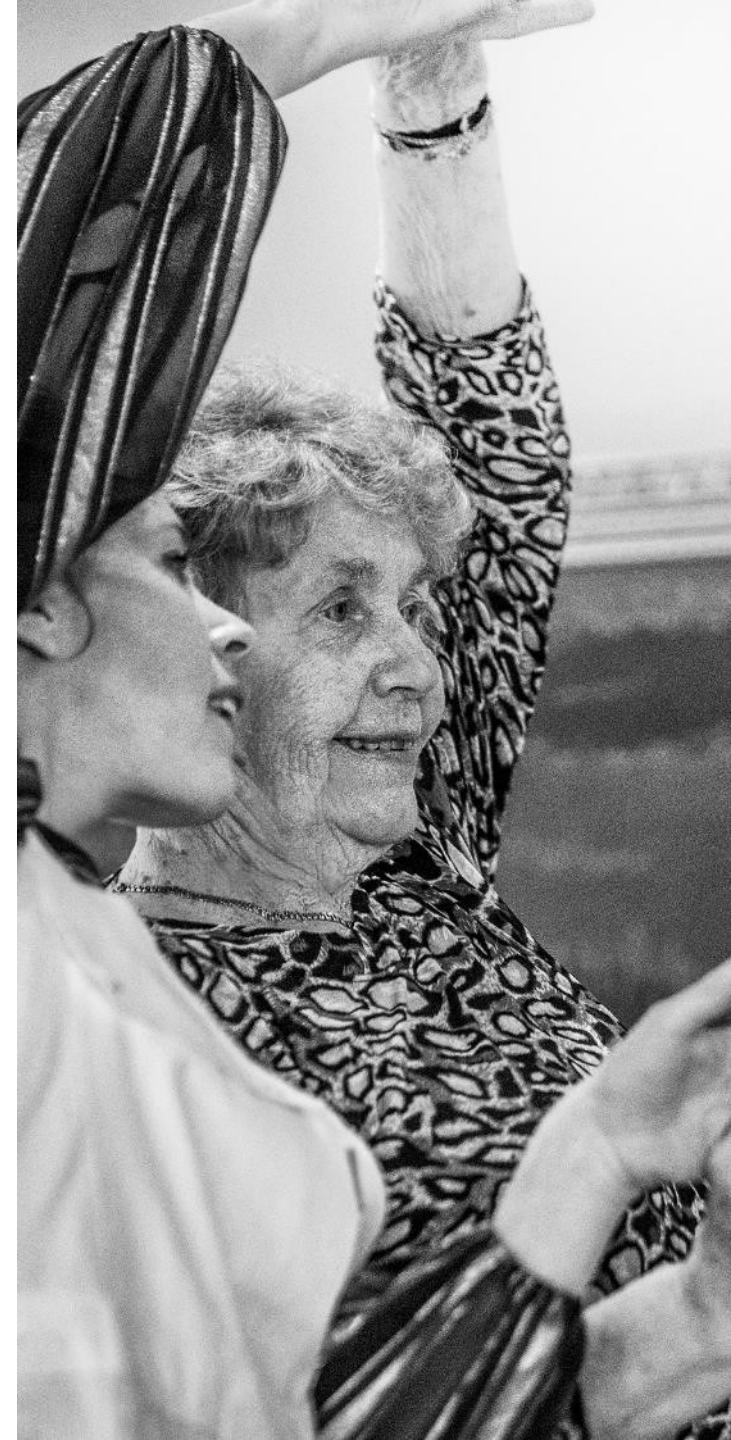
- up to EUR 7,000 with full funding
- up to EUR 40,000 (maximum of 70% of the total budget)
- up to EUR 100,000 (maximum of 50% of the total budget)



Sample projects: Arts and Culture Programme

Happy End

- An arts project realised in collaboration with residents living in sheltered accommodation.
- Nordic artists travel around Nordic sheltered accommodation facilities to give older people the opportunity to express their creativity through dance and other forms of expression.
- The project has resulted in a photo exhibition and a short film.



Nordic-Baltic Mobility Programme

The Nordic-Baltic Mobility Programme for Culture strengthens artistic and cultural co-operation in the Nordic and Baltic countries. The focus of the programme is on increasing the exchange of knowledge, contacts, presence, and interest in Nordic and Baltic art and culture.



Mobility funding

Mobility funding is for professionals in the arts and culture sector, to be used for travelling to and staying in another Nordic or Baltic country.

Funding can be granted to:

- an individual or groups of up to six people; and
- residents of the Nordic or Baltic countries.

Funding will cover the cost of travel and/or accommodation for up to ten days in another Nordic or Baltic country.



Network funding

Network funding facilitates meetings and exchanges of ideas and knowledge between artists and professionals in the field of art and culture.

Funding can be granted to:

- networks with partners from three Nordic and/or Baltic countries; and
- a series of joint meetings, conferences, etc.

Short-term network funding: up to EUR 20,000 (maximum of 70% of the total budget)

Long-term network funding: up to EUR 100,000 (maximum of 50% of the total budget)



Funding for residential visits

Funding gives Nordic and Baltic residential centres the opportunity to invite artists from other Nordic and Baltic countries.

Funding can be granted to:

— residential centres or new initiatives within the residential facilities sector.

A maximum of EUR 50,000 can be applied for and granted.

The funding covers the residential visit of at least two artists living in another Nordic or Baltic country.

Norden 0–30

The Norden 0–30 programme seeks to strengthen the organisation, influence, and participation of children and young people in political, social, and cultural contexts.



Volt – arts and language programme for children and young people

Volt supports projects that raise interest in art, culture, and languages in other Nordic countries and areas. Emphasis is placed on the creativity, participation, and co-determination of young people.



Application process

- Application
- Criteria check
- Expert assessment
- Expert group meeting and decision
- Decision letters sent out
- If funding is granted, a contract is drafted and signed
- Status report / final report, depending on the programme and funding amount.
