Development and implementation of sexual education curriculum and methodology for teacher training and organizing a training course for health education teachers. <b>Results:</b> A training course was conducted during 3 months and consisted of 3 sessions (2 days each) for 20 participants (teachers and students, all women). Education manual of interactive lessons was updated, printed and distributed to the participants. The education set for teaching contraceptive methods was compiled and distributed to the participants. Merle and Berth attended the final event.

Baltic Sea Islands Network B7 presents stories of the islands in the framework of the Tallinn Culture Capital 2011 in Tallinn and Hiiumaa. Objective is to raise awareness of and promote the maritime culture, climate and sustainable development in the BS and islands. <b>Results:</b> 3 storytelling events, audience ca 1200 persons (500 young people, 700 women/girls, 500 men/boys), people reached by media in B7 (10 000 persons).

I attended one day in the conference.

Establishment of sustainable North-Baltic network between the organisations and people are participating in the project. <b>Results:</b> Two 2-days training-workshops by both partic. Baltic countries. The main lecturers from Swedish partner-organisation. The hosting country provides local lecturers and will organise a visit to organisations related to the theme of employment of socially disadvantaged people. Good examples of social enterprising like MTÜ Abikäsi and job centres in Estonia are providing job for disabled people. Training materials (approximately 500 p) prepared by Swedish experts, translated and adapted to the local situation.
